Description: On 3rd of October, Department of Political Science in collaboration with Centre for the Study of Disability Inclusion under the aegis of IQAC organised a lecture on the topic Law, State and Society: Examining Constitutional provisions of equal opportunity. The invited speaker was N. Annavaram, Assistant Professor (Department of Sociology) University of Hyderabad, Hyderabad.

This seminar was attended by 71 students of the department.

The event began with the introduction of the speaker by Dr. Md. Zubeer Ahmed, Director, CSDI. He introduced Centre for the Study of Disability Inclusion which is the new IQAC centre commenced in March with 11 faculties working in it with the focus on Sensitisation, Training, Outreach and Research.

N. Annavaram Sir addressed the audience by citing the difference between rites and rights. Rites are embodied in religion to claim for one's share where first share is of divine god, second for the priest, 3rd is to the community and what is left is one's own share. He highlighted that with hunger of power and greedy nature of human, human state emerged as a compromise where Rights were the part of contract between people and state. He emphasized that rights are the power of constitution as limit the absolute power of state. Highlighting the importance of equality in

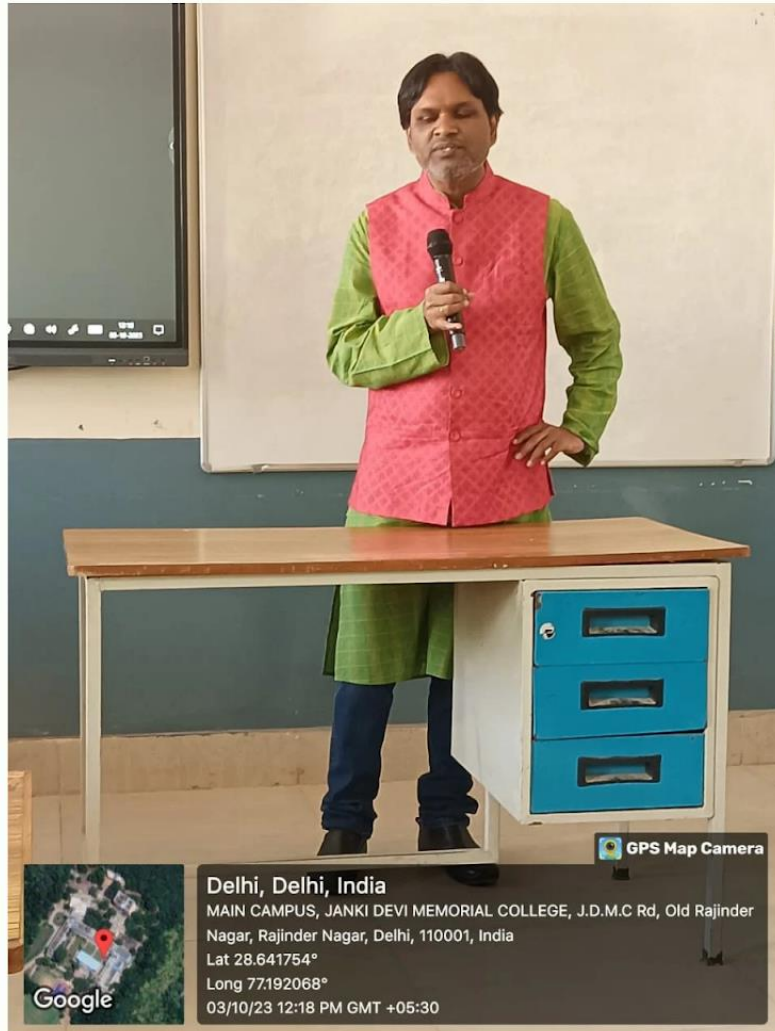

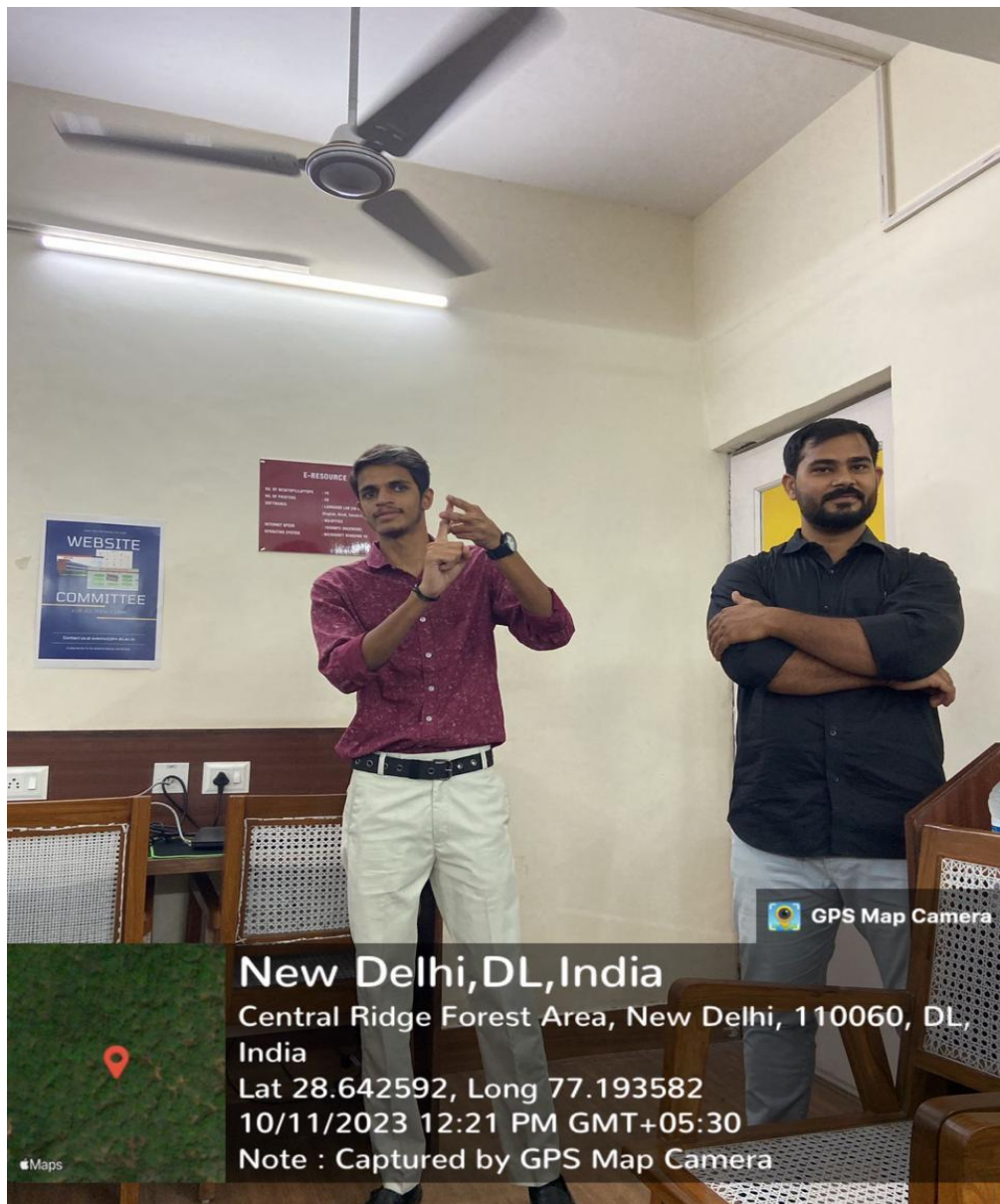

After the description, students from the audience were called upon to participate and the volunteers of CSDI blindfolded them and they were asked to walk with white cane or without it.

More than 100 students participated in the event and shared their valuable experiences with the Saksham team. Along with the students, professors also participated in the event and emphasized the importance of sensitization among the students regarding the difficulties faced by visually impaired people and how they are leading their life independently with equipments like white cane.

The event concluded on a high note, blending enthrallment with interactivity, fostering a deeper understanding among participants.

The primary objective was to sensitize students to the hurdles faced by the visually impaired while spotlighting the vital role of aids like the white cane in facilitating their everyday lives.

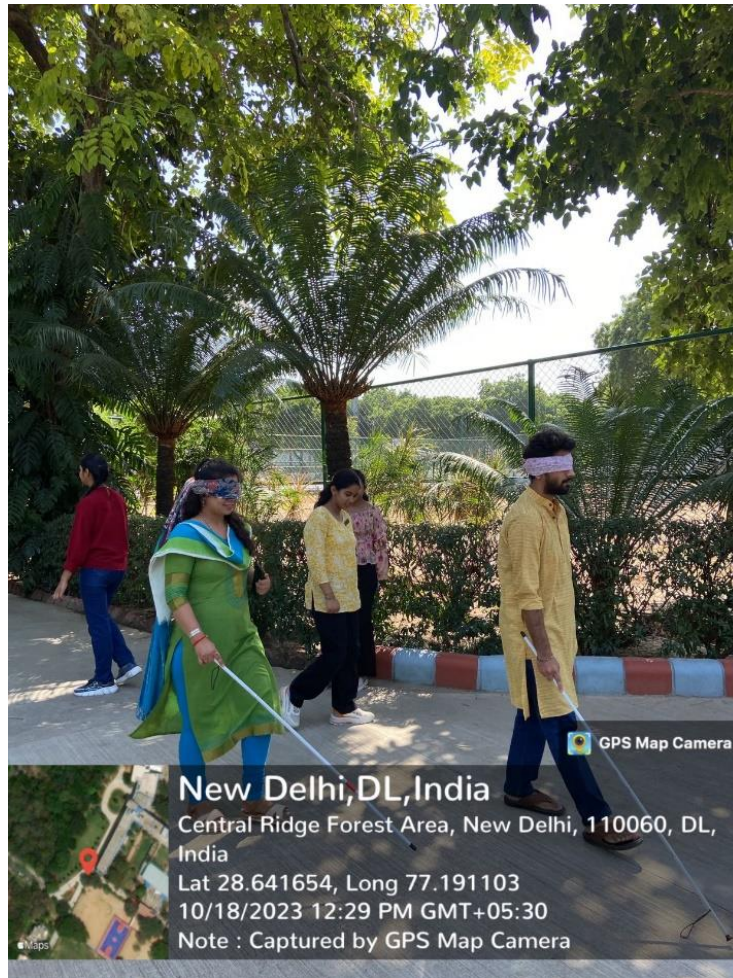

Lecture: Deafness And Cochlear Implant Infrastructures

The centre has organized an online lecture on the topic sensory futures: Deafness and Cochlear Implant Infrastructures in India on 27th November, 2023 by Michele Friedner, associate professor, Department of Comparative Human Development, University of Chicago, Illinois, USA.

At the beginning of the event, hosts of the event Nivedita and Iffat introduced the speaker and welcomed her and Dr. Md. Zubeer Ahmed, director of CSDI gave a brief introduction about the CSDI, what our main four core aspects on which we are working, our collaborations, ambitions, etc and welcomed the speaker for the enlightening discussion.

The speaker came with few really interesting points to make us aware about deafness and condition of cochlear implant in India which are as follows:

- . Speaker started with the condition of deaf education in India in which she highlighted few findings of her research like the conditions of Indian Sign Language , how the sign language of 1880s is still being used in India .
- . Indian Sign Language is not used worldwide which led to no or less opportunities outside India
- . There is need for better deaf schools, teachers well equipped with the knowledge of sign language, more inclusive classrooms and how lack of all of these make deaf education terrible in India.
- . The technique of ORALISM should be promoted in deaf education.
- . Then the speaker talked about that the hospitality sector is promoting deaf employees but who are really getting benefitted from this we need to question.
- . Now, she talked about the infrastructure of Cochlear Implant in India and the government schemes related to this .
- . She stated Cochlear Implant in India as Surgical Assertion of state power.
- . Cochlear implant needs to come with all round development process like cultural change, parenting practice, AVT principles, etc.
- . Cochlear implant comes with a lot of things like costly surgery, lifelong dependence on

manufactures, changing family and social relations.
. Innovation should come with maintenance.

Objective: To make people understand where we as a country stand in deaf education and inclusion and how Cochlear Implant is a way forward with its challenges.

Learning objective : Cochlear Implant is just a start and care and maintenance is the oil that should be done every day. Also, we need to question the fact that what kind of person are we really creating with this.

After the speaker ends her part, the floor was opened for questions. A lot of amazing questions came up and made this enlightening session more exquisite. The session ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Vineeta Bhatt.

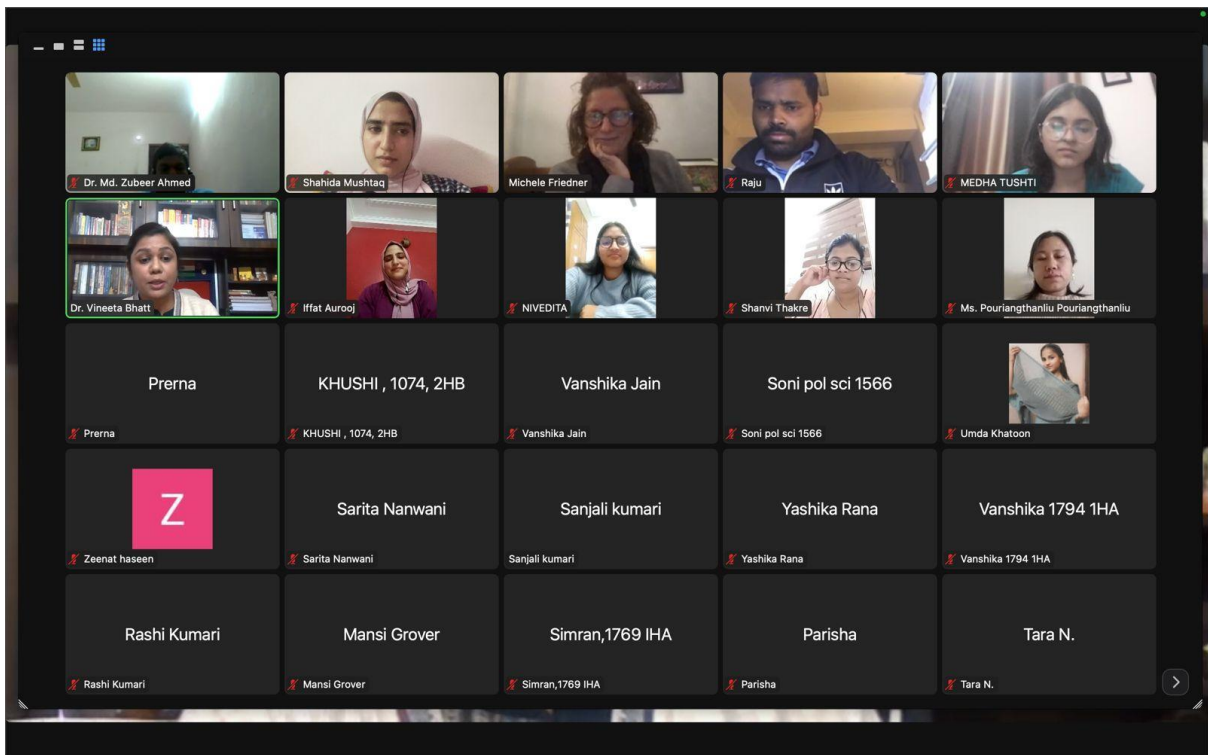

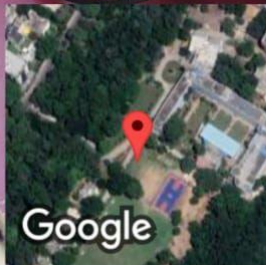
