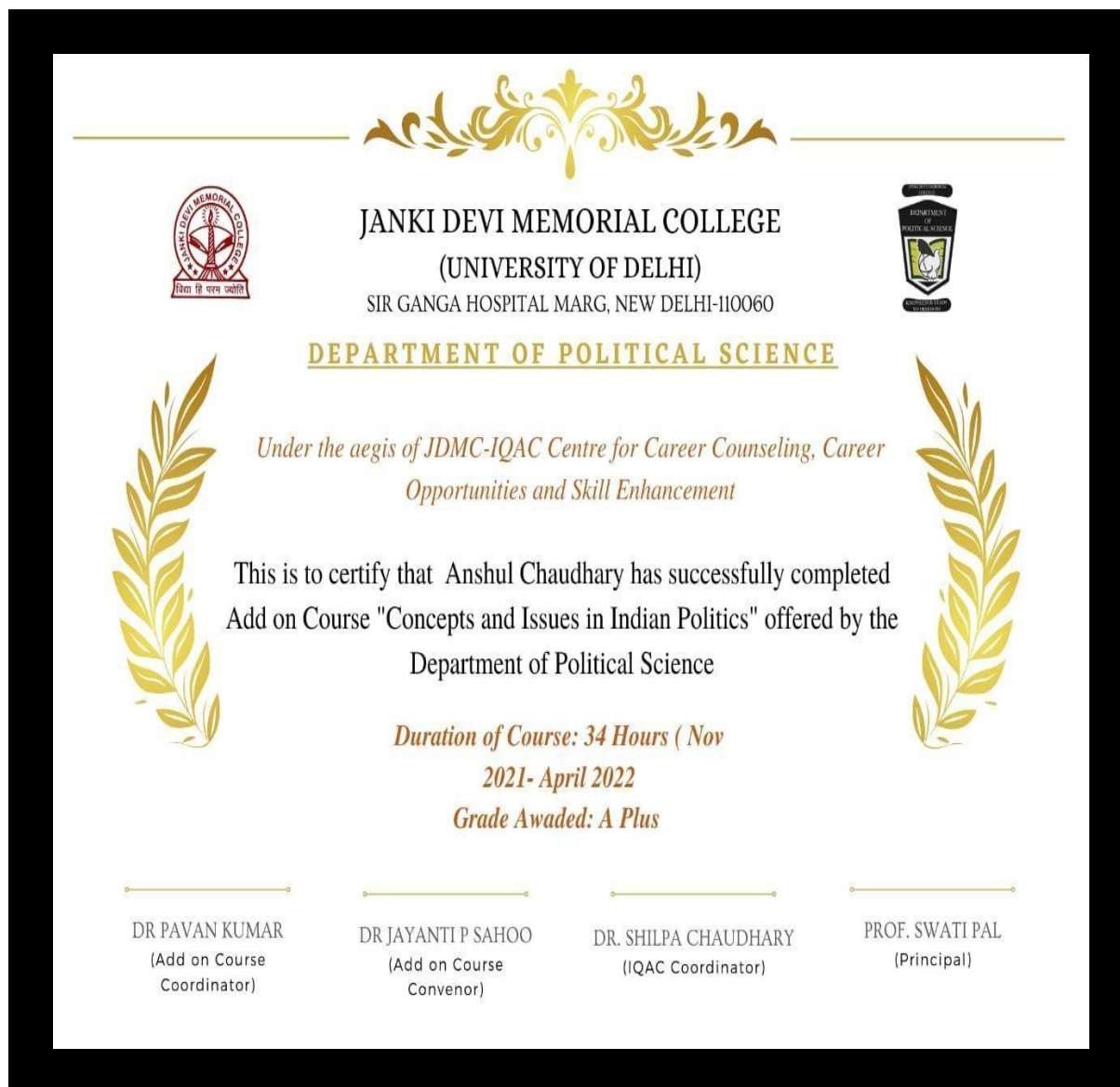

Empirical Research: A Step by Step Guide for the Beginners

The Economics department has introduced an online Add-on Course on 'Empirical Research: A Step by Step Guide for the Beginners' in the academic session 2021-22.

4. Report (300 words)

The primary objective of this course is to develop a research orientation among the students and to acquaint them with fundamentals of research methods. Specifically, the course aims at introducing them to the basic concepts used in research and to scientific social research methods and their approach. It includes discussions on sampling techniques, research designs and techniques of analysis.

On the completion of the course, students went through the journey of research and gained an understanding of its process. They got research exposure by actual conduct of research on an empirical issue of their interest. The students got acquainted with formulation of research problems and research design. They also got hands-on experience of how to process

data and display results using MS-Excel and learned how to write a Research proposal as well as Project Report

5. Outline and output of course

The duration of the course was 30 (15 hours Theory + 15 Hours Practical) hours

The various outcomes of the course helped students to learn:

- What is research, the research process and how to formulate a research problem?
- How to review literature?
- Plagiarism and reference management
- Understanding about research design and study designs
- Data collection methods and constructing a research instrument for primary data collection
- Learning techniques for sample selection
- How to process and display data using MS-Excel
- Writing research proposal and research report (1 hour)

6. Evaluation Method

24 students successively completed the course. Assessment was carried out on the basis of:

- a. MCQ-based assessment to test their understanding of research process and,
- b. 'Research Proposal' and 'Research Report' developed and submitted by students.

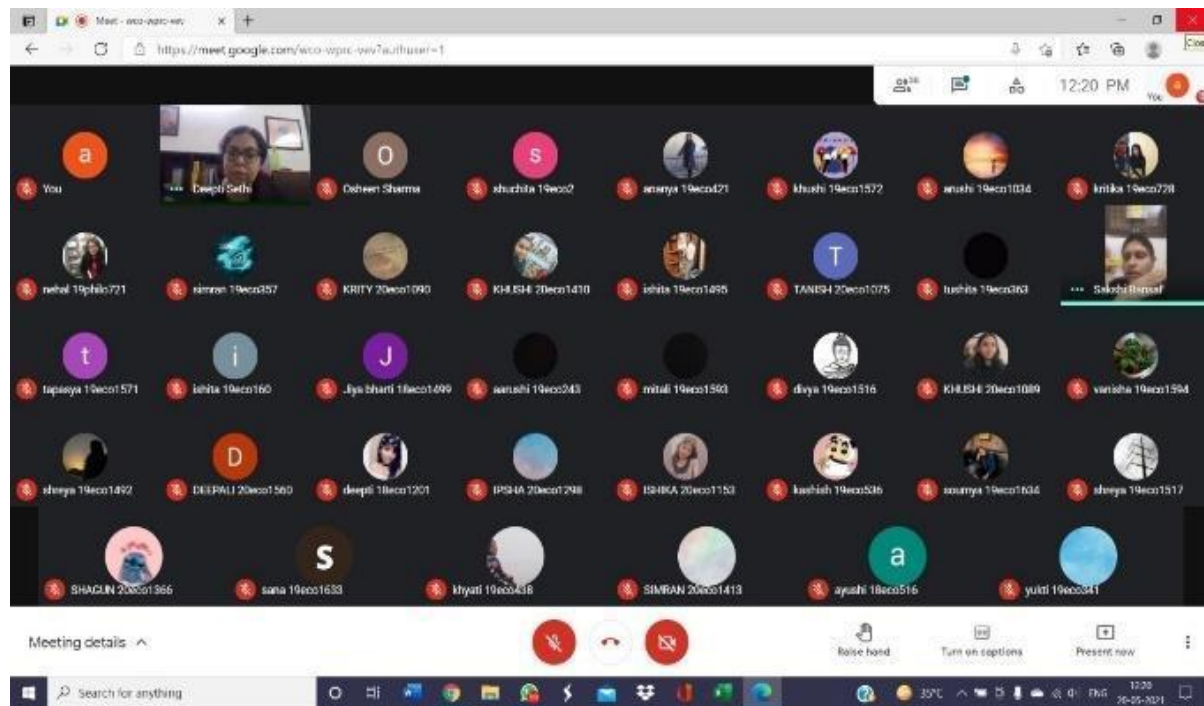

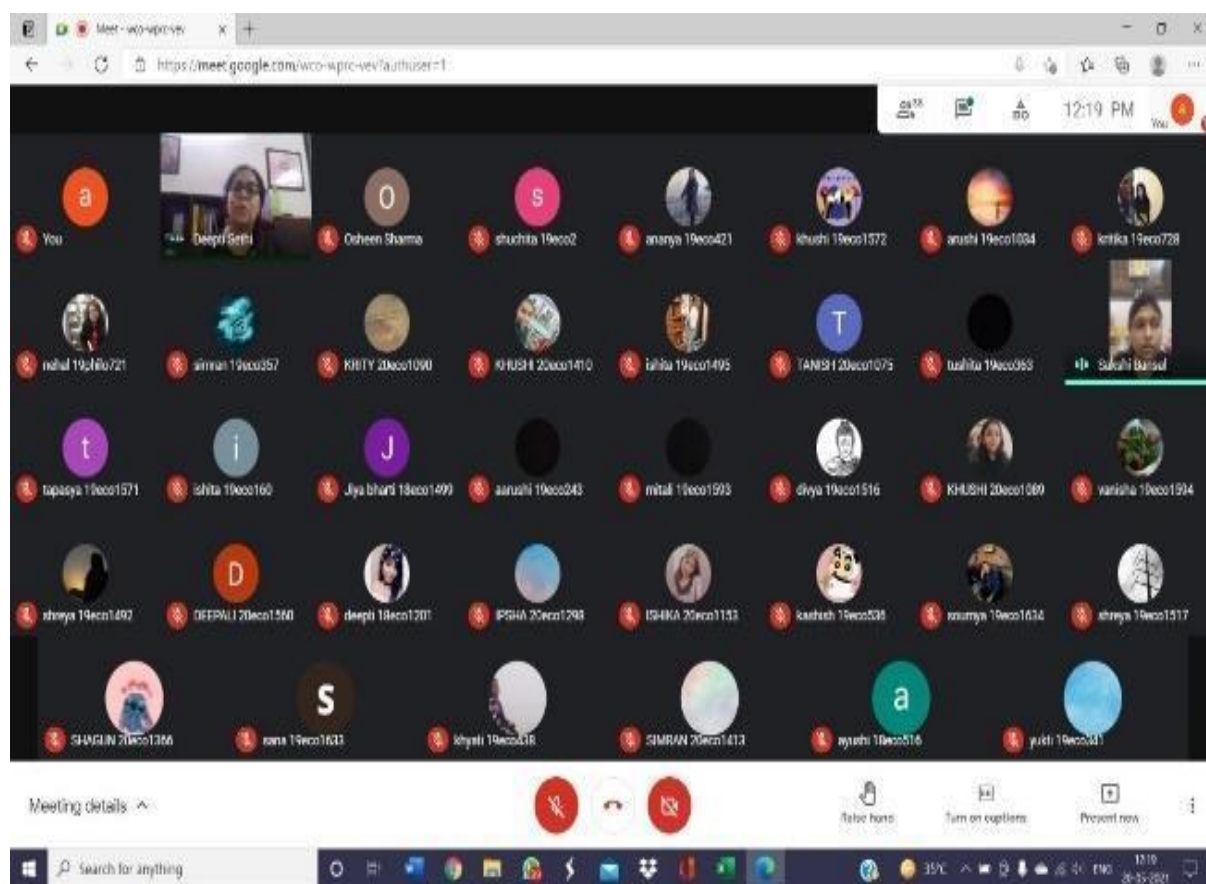
